The club also holds special events throughout the year as well as ongoing bookclub, walking and quilting for interested members.

HISTORY OF THE GENERAL FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS (GFWC)

For over 100 years the GFWC has worked to address the most pressing needs of our communities, and of our nation. This includes promoting education, preserving national resources, stressing good citizenship and good health, supporting participation in the arts, conservation, contributing to world peace and international understanding.

- Initiated the white center lines on highways
- Established 75% of American's public libraries
- Supported equal pay for equal work
- Worked for the passage of the Pure Food and Drugs Act
- Opened the GFWC Women's History and Resource Center in Washington, D.C.
- Provided over \$4M in books and materials to schools and public libraries

OVWC HISTORY

1911 - Mrs. Josephine Pierpont Ginn built the clubhouse in memory of her second husband Frederick Ginn, a rancher in Ojai. It was to be used for social and educational purposes. Responsibility for the building was turned over to the Kings Daughters, a group of women sponsored by the Presbyterian Church in 1899 who did good works in the community.

Mrs. Pierpont Ginn gave “ownership” of the building to all the women in Ojai and that is still true today. The land was donated anonymously. James C. Leslie was the builder, but Josephine did most of the architectural work herself. The desk in the front corner was for farmers who came into town to collect their mail. They could use the slant-top desk for their return correspondence. The ladies would serve lemonade in the summer or hot tea in the winter. There used to be a fireplace in the foyer for heat but the mantle is all that is left of it. If you look closely at the windows in the foyer you can see the imperfections in the glass which were typical of the day.

1915 - The Kings Daughters became OVWC “to enlarge their sphere of usefulness” and became part of the General Federation of Women’s Clubs & CFWC and TAD.

The building became Historical Landmark #8 in 1992.

In the early 2000s the club had a big fundraiser and wrote for and received grants to enable major renovations which included a proper foundation, refinishing the auditorium floor and adding new ceiling fan/lights, a remodeled kitchen and activity room.


